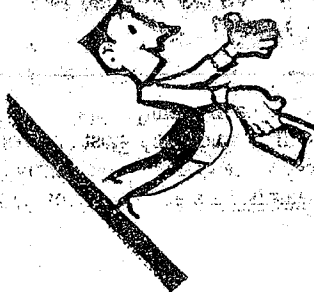

Quick! Name the reindeer in that American classic, "Twas the Night Before Christmas."
Dasher, Dancer, Prancer, Vixen, Comet, Cupid, Donder and Blitzen. (Rudolph didn't show up until almost century later.)

True or false: "Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer" was written in 1939 by an advertising copywriter for Montgomery Ward.

True. The story of the little reindeer with the shiny nose was printed in Christmas giveaway booklets in 1939 and 1946. It wasn't until 1949 that Gene Autry recorded the song version, creating one of the biggest

Christmas hits ever.

The traditional Christmas carol sings of "three kings," but how many magi were there?

St. Matthew's account doesn't give a tally or name names, simply saying "wise men" came out of the East, following a star, and bearing gold, frankincense and myrrh for the baby Jesus.

The Western church settled on three magi, probably linking the number of gifts to the number of givers. But the Orthodox church set the number at 12, and decided to celebrate their arrival on Christmas Day, not Jan. 6, as is done in the

West.

Christmas tree facts:

■ President Franklin Pierce put up the first White House Christmas tree in 1856.

■ Pagan Romans carried trees blazing with candles, reminders of the sun's return in the spring, during their mid-December Saturnalia celebrations.

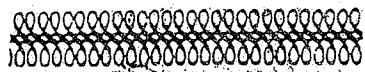
■ The first hooks for Christmas tree ornaments were advertised in a wholesaler's catalog in 1892.

■ The first icicles — thin strips of silver foil — were sold in Nuremberg, Germany, in 1878. Spun glass angel hair followed two years later.

■ Edward Johnson, a colleague of Thomas Edison at Edison Electric Company, put up the first electrically lighted Christmas tree in 1882.

The Pilgrims spent their first Christmas in the New World — Dec. 25, 1620 — felling timber and erecting a common building. Good Puritans that they were, they didn't celebrate Christmas, which they considered a pagan holiday.

Two decades later, the colonists passed a law forbidding the celebration of "any such day as Christmas and the like." The fine for untoward feasting or simply not working was five shillings.

As well as the dish and the spoon

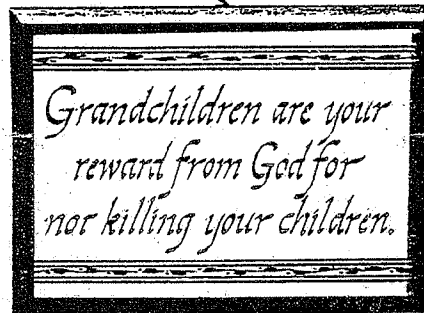
Little Bo Peep

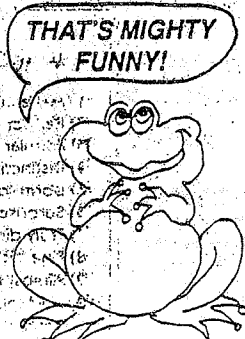

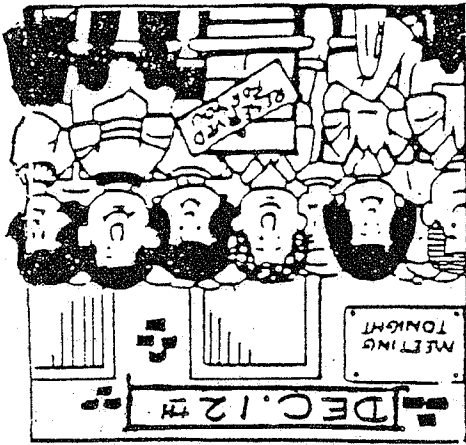

COOKIN' IN THE BACK COUNTRY

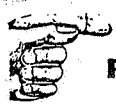
PUMPKIN (SQUASH) BUNDT CAKE

- 4 eggs
- 2 c sugar
- 1 1/2 c oil
- 2 c flour
- 3/4 c chopped nuts
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 tsp baking soda
- 3 tsp cinnamon
- 1 1/2 c canned pumpkin (squash)

Cream sugar and eggs.
Add rest of ingredients.
Mix well.
Pour into heavily greased and floured Bundt or tube pan.
Bake @ 300° for 1 to 1 1/2 hrs.

Mix powered sugar & milk.
Drip over top after cool.

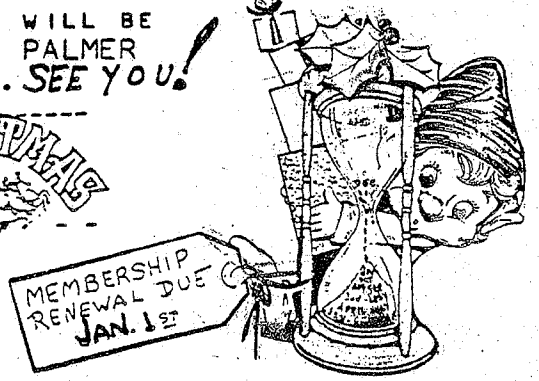
