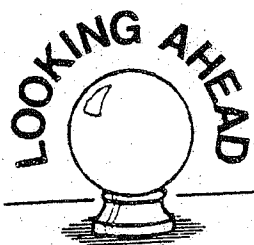

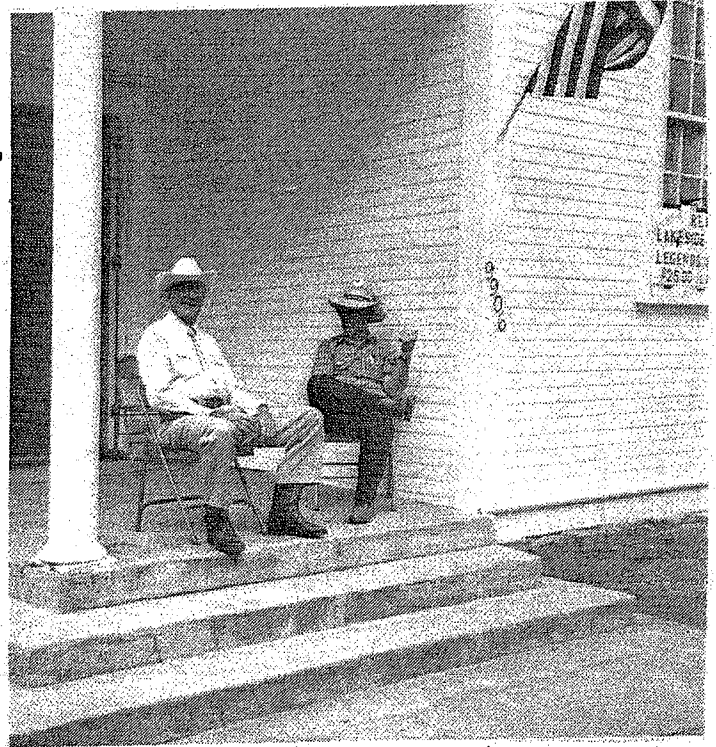

LAKESIDE IS THE HUB OF RECREATION

Dedication and ribbon cutting ceremonies were held on June 23 for El Capitan Open Space Preserve. The Bureau of Land Management donated 2,800 acres for use as wilderness trails, riding trails; for nature lovers, native study and preservation groups and many others.

Bob Stuart, administrative assistant to George Bailey thanked the Bureau of Land Management, Lakeside Planning Group, County Parks Board, Honor Camp crews who worked on the trails, SDG&E for donating poles, Jerry Lester and Dave Martin who donated time and equipment for the grading.

Phase One of the Preserve is now completed with a parking lot for vehicles and trailers located at Wild Cat Canyon and Blue Sky Ranch Roads.

What other town in the county has as many lakes, parks and recreational areas as Lakeside? Following is a list of recreation places within a few short miles of our town:

(1) Lindo Lake and Park; (2) El Monte Park; (3) El Capitan Lake and Dam; (4) San Vicente Lake and Dam; (5) Flinn Springs Co. Park; (6) Lake Jennings Lake and Park; (7) Cactus Park (8) Silverwood Wildlife Sanctuary; (9) Stelzer Park; and the newest one (10) El Capitan Open Space Preserve.

DID YOU KNOW THAT---

El Capitan Reservoir is the largest inland body of water in San Diego Co.? It was built from 1932 to 1934 on the San Diego River, seven miles east of Lakeside.

The 30-ton statue, completed in 1939 by Donal Hord was made from a block of grey granite from Lakeside which was hauled to his studio in Pacific Beach? Called "The Guardian of Water" it can be seen in front of the harbor entrance to the San Diego County Administration building.

Cowles Mountain is the highest point within San Diego County city limits? It stands 1,591 feet high. and was named for George A. Cowles, a rancher who lived in east county from 1877 to 1887.

MERCY! WHAT A CELEBRATION

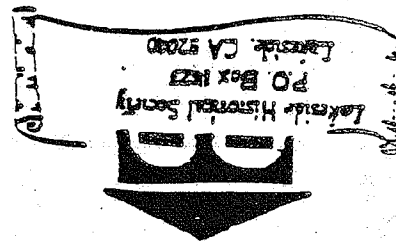
