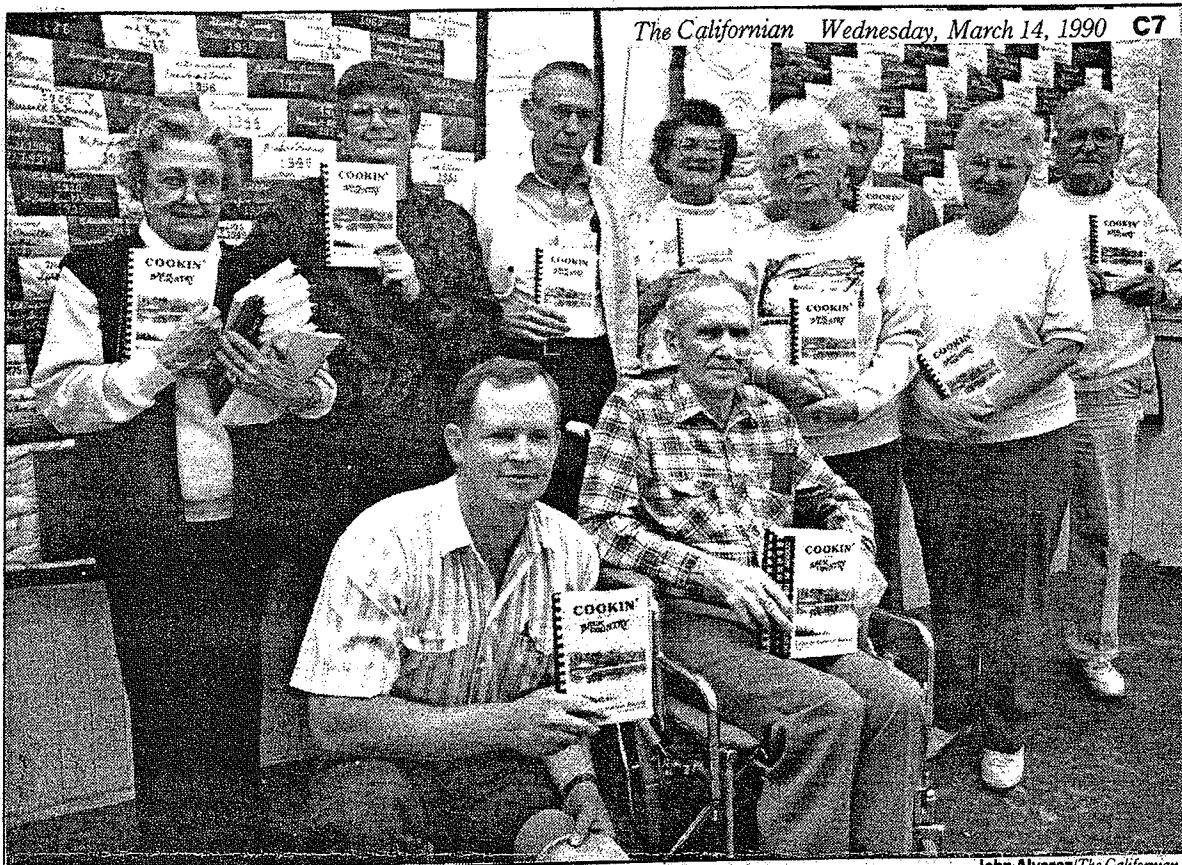

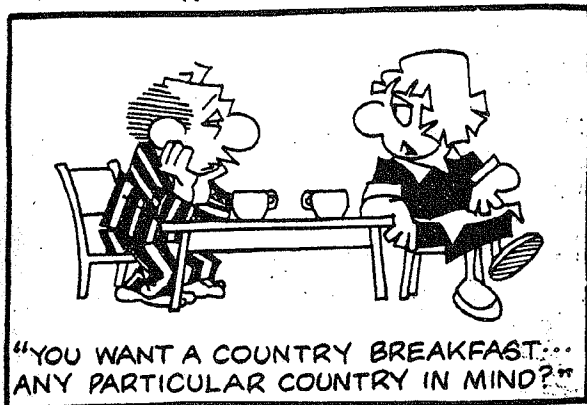

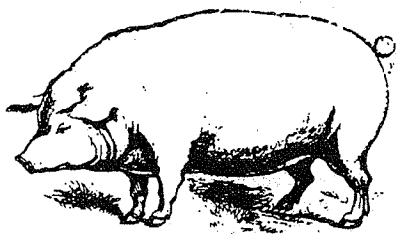

Lakeside school in network

Tierra del Sol joins elite school group

LAKESIDE — Because of its state-of-the-art status in education, Tierra del Sol Middle School in Lakeside has been selected to join an elite group: the California Regional Networks of Middle Grade Partnership Schools.

It is among 10 middle schools selected countywide, and the only one from East County. A total of 200 out of 3,400 California middle schools were chosen to help reform middle-grade education.

As a member of the network, Tierra del Sol will get state funding priority, said Principal Steve Halfaker.

Tierra del Sol was selected because it made the most progress in implementing recommendations put forth by a state task force.

The task force's report, "Caught in the Middle: Educational Reform for Young Adolescents in California Public Schools," triggered a push in 1988 to rejuvenate schooling for early adolescents.

Tierra del Sol's work with the other schools will help to change instruction methods for nearly 100,000 California middle school students. The networks will meet to assess middle-school curricula and early adolescent needs. The participating sites have made a three-year commitment to the partnership.

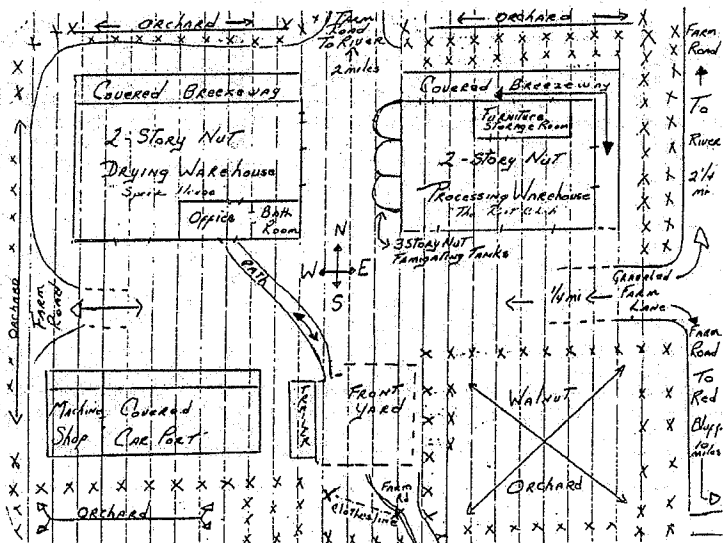

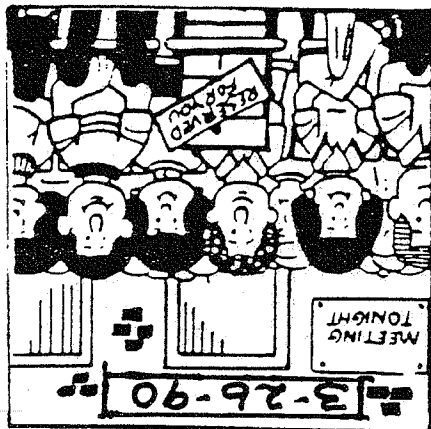

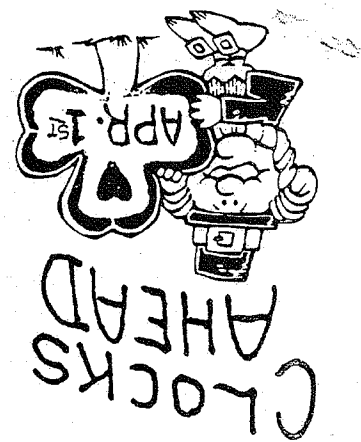
The Big Cigar Idea

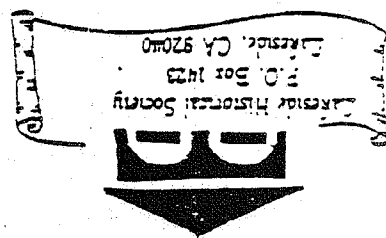
The San Diego County Tobacco Growers Association wanted the city park land to be used for growing tobacco!

Lakeside planners turn down latest High Meadows scheme

LAKESIDE — Changes in an approved Muth Valley development received less than a rousing welcome from the Lakeside Community Planning Group as the group rejected a new tentative development plan and wrote a lengthy list of concerns it has about the project.

Fargo Industries continues to propose 250 homes for its High Meadows Ranch development, but it wants to decrease the size of nearly 100 lots and increase the size of its proposed golf course from 60 acres to 110 acres.

In not recommending approval of the new development plan, the planning group said the plan fails to conform with the Lakeside Community Plan by moving away from the surrounding area's rural character.

The Board of Supervisors will act upon the group's recommendation, but member Gordon Shackelford noted the planning group is 0-5 on the High Meadows Project — the board of supervisors have gone against the recommendation

of the planning group every time the development has come before them, he said.

High Meadows Ranch has a 17 year history of changing development plans, he said, and each one moves further and further away from Lakeside's rural character.

The project does that by decreasing the lots sizes and clustering them closer together, he said. He also expressed concern, as did many other board members, that if the proposed golf course proved to be unprofitable, somebody would want to build homes on it, thereby increasing the density of the ranch even more.

Max Love, project manager for Fargo Industries objected to the suggestion, but admitted there is no guarantee of financial success for the course, which will be part of a private club with only 500 members.

The 6,400-yard course will be an 18-hole, par-72 course with three large water features. The previously proposed course was a 5,500-yard, 18-hole, par-70 course.

Other concerns raised by the group were:

■ The impact of increased traf-

fic on Muth Valley Road and Wildcat Canyon Road;

■ The Lakeside Sanitation District's requirement of a six-inch sewer pipe leading out of the project instead of the originally proposed four-inch pipe, which could make higher density in Muth Valley possible;

■ The failure of Fargo Industries to thus far secure a service agreement with Lakeside Water District for the increased needs for water service with the expansion of the golf course;

■ The possibility of nighttime lighting, which the developers say has never been considered;

■ Inconsistencies in service agreement letters received by the developer;

■ The lack of a plan for use of reclaimed water in the project;

■ A lack of sufficient information on the project's grading plan;

■ The visual impacts the inclusion of a home on the ranch's highest point might have.

The development changes will be considered further at the planning group's next meeting, March 21, when another phase of the development's approval process is brought before it. (hbo)
