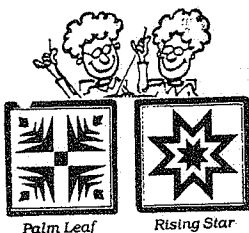

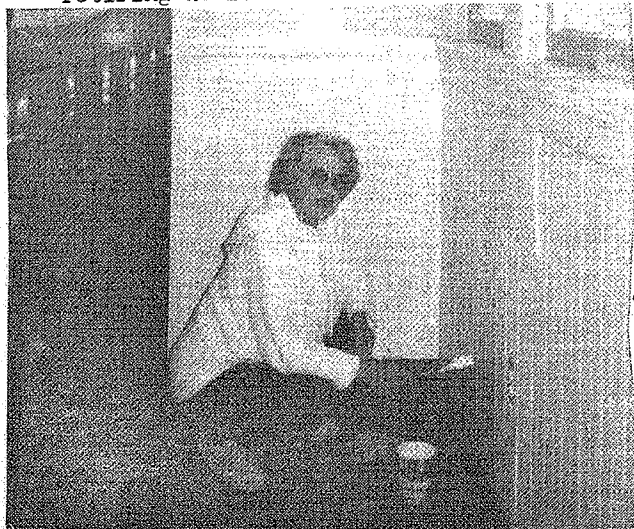

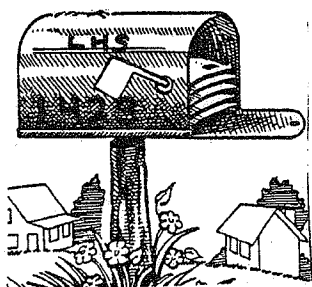

Tom Barkdull passed away Sept. 21, 1990 in Madison, South Dakota. Tom, Evelyn, and their three children moved to Lakeside in 1947 on Julian Ave. next to the old Frog Farm. They immediately became involved in community affairs. Tom was a charter member of the Kiwanis Club and served as president in 1950, succeeding the first president, Elmer "Dutch" Walker. The entire family were active participants in Our Lady of Perpetual Help, school affairs; and Tom sang the lead in "The Moonlighters", a quartet that was recognized nationally.

They moved to Arizona in 1960, then to South Dakota in 1970.

COOKIN' IN THE BACK COUNTRY

Fortune Cookies

About 36 cookies

Equipment:

White paper
Permanent-ink pen
Scissors
Baking sheet
Wooden spoon with long,
dowel-shaped handle

Ingredients:

3 egg whites
¼ cup sugar
Pinch of salt
4 ounces unsalted butter,
melted
½ cup sifted flour
2 teaspoons pure almond
extract

Cut 3 dozen strips of white paper ¼-inch wide and about 1½ inches long. Write fortunes on the papers and fold each in half. Set aside.

Beat egg whites until frothy and gradually beat in sugar and salt until dissolved. Stir in melted butter, flour and almond extract, and beat until blended.

Drop the dough in rounded teaspoons about 3 inches apart onto an ungreased baking sheet. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes at 350 degrees until the edges of the cookies are golden brown.

Working very quickly, remove 1 cookie at a time from the baking sheet. Hold the cookie in the palm of your hand and place 1 folded fortune in the center. Fold the cookie in half. Drape the folded cookie over the handle of a wooden spoon. Fold the corners around the spoon to meet and gently press together. Slide the cookie off the spoon.

Repeat with remaining cookies. If cookies become too brittle to fold as you work, return them to the oven for a minute to soften. (From "Gifts of Food," by Susan Costner; Crown Publishers.)

Colorado dinosaur embryo may be 150 million years old

PROVO, Utah (UPI) — A dinosaur embryo, believed to be the oldest ever unearthed in North America, was discovered by a Brigham Young University student on a remote southwestern Colorado mountain, BYU officials said yesterday.

"The find is significant," said geology professor Wade Miller, director of the BYU Earth Science Museum, because no dinosaur eggshell as old as the one found in Colorado and with such an advanced embryo — near the hatching stage — "has been reported in North America."

The embryo is a Dryosaurus dinosaur, believed to be 135 million to 150 million years old, Miller said. BYU geology student Rod Scheetz discovered pieces of the embryo and eggshell in May at a road-construction site near Uravan, Colo., a community of about 800 residents.

Dryosaurus, discovered in 1878 has been compared with the modern gazelle because of its slender build and long, agile hind legs. The herbivore with teeth was a member of the hypsilophodontids, a family of small to medium-size dinosaurs.

Pendulum's swing should offset buildings swaying in winds

A 37-story office building nearing completion in Osaka, Japan, is topped by an unusual feature — a gigantic pendulum designed to prevent the building from swaying in high winds.

The 345-foot Crystal Tower is the first in the world to use a pendulum to counter high winds that cause the top floors of tall buildings to sway, according to the builder, Takenaka Komuten Co.

Six 90-ton water containers used for the building's air-conditioning serve as weights for the pendulum, suspended from a beam by 13-foot iron bars. When swaying occurs, the pendulum swings in the opposite direction of the building to offset the motion.

Fish Census?



With all the Federal "census" news we have been bombarded with lately the "actual count" of our ocean's fish population has been a popular subject of much debate. The actual number however is only an "educated" guesstimate. Biologists have claimed that there are between 15,000 to over 40,000 separate species swimming in our oceans. The figure that is most often quoted though is 25,000. The reasons for this wide discrepancy are: Some species have not been named, some species have been named with more than one name through subtle differences, some species have extreme differences between the sexes, so much so that they appear to be of a separate family. But most amazing of all is one species, the Grouper which has over 350 separate families. This fish will first mature as a female and then switch sexes entirely to become a male, usually from 7 to 10 years of age!

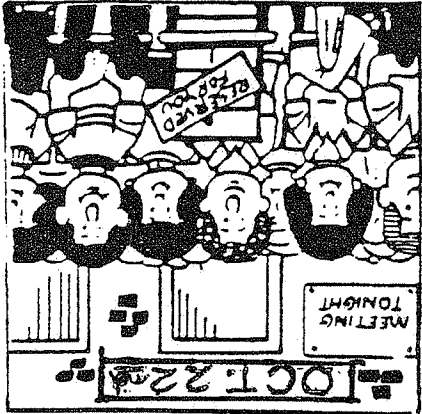

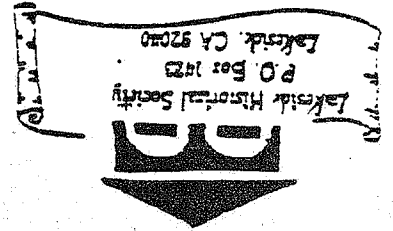

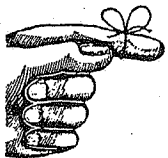
