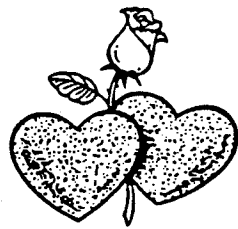

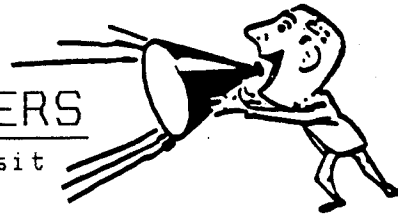

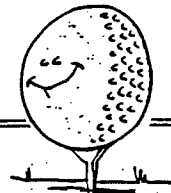

More than 60 recommended reductions include our very own century-old Lindo Lake Park, Harry Griffen Park, located in both El Cajon & La Mesa; Nancy Jane park in Crest; and Eucalyptus Park in La Mesa.

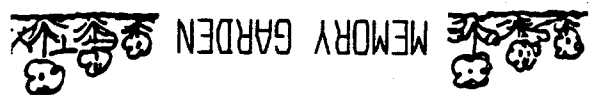

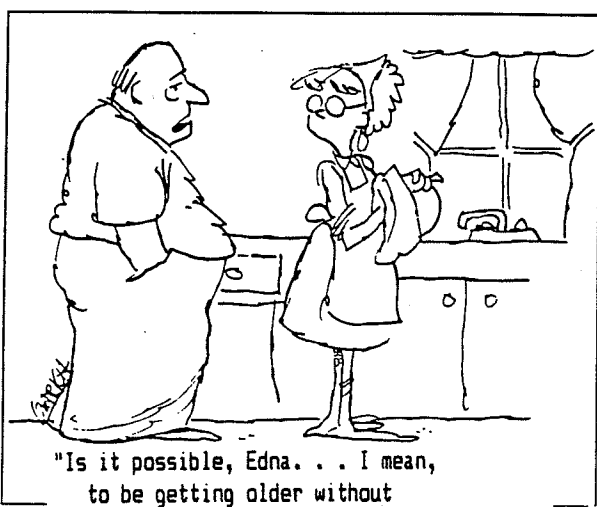
