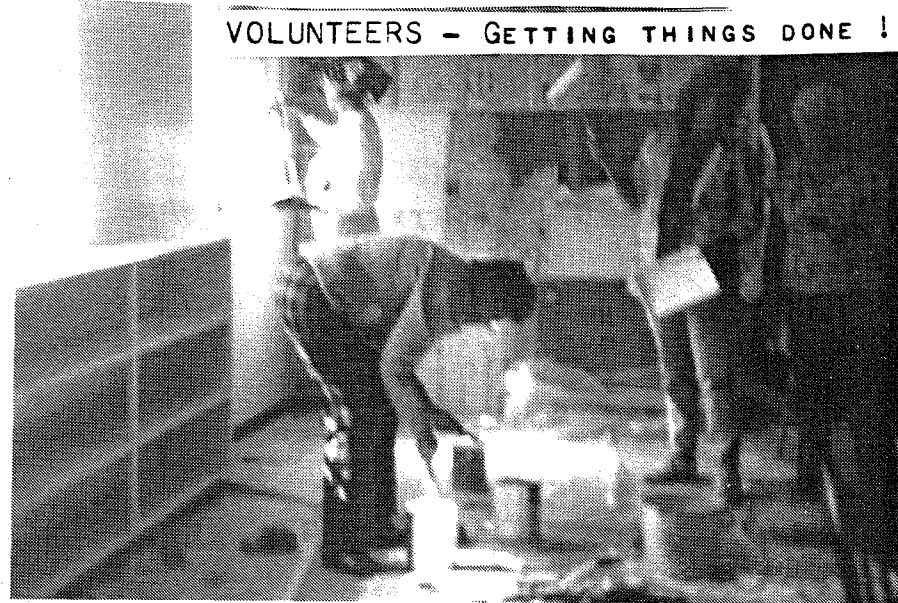

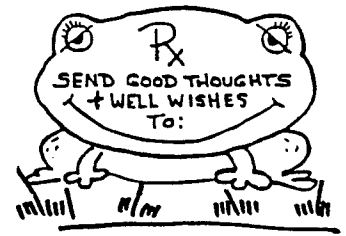
Lakeside postmaster

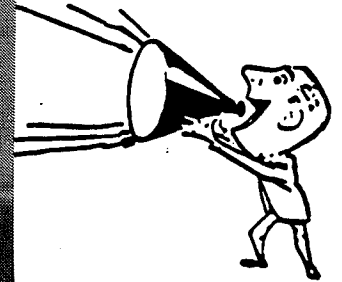
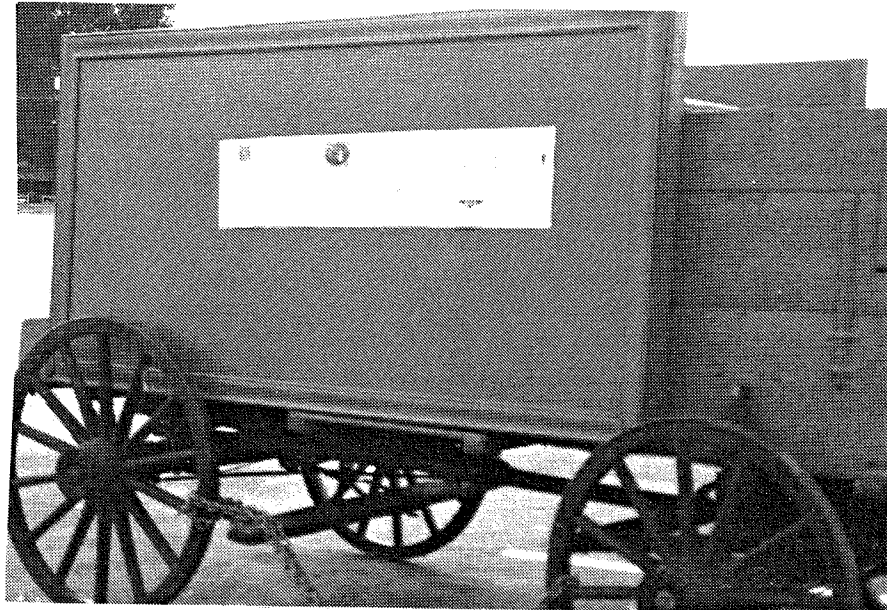
From Rex & Julie Anderson's son - a high school senior in Julian :

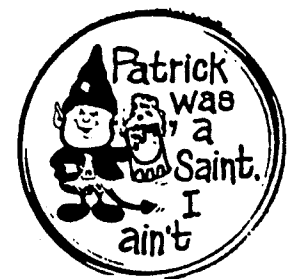
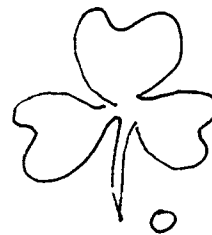
DIANA BANEAGAS and JANET OWENS of the Golden Touch added the final touch by repainting wheels.

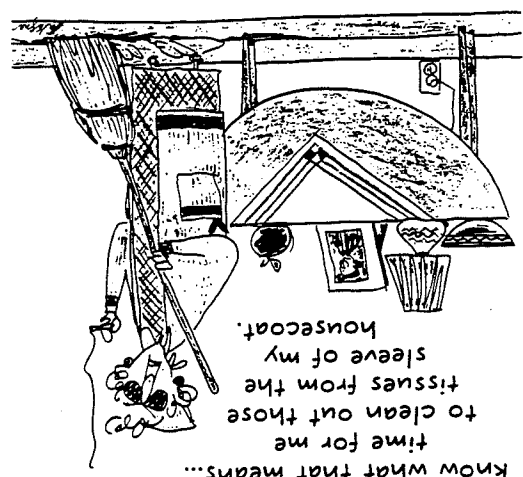

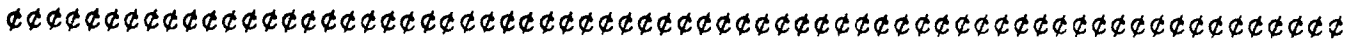
