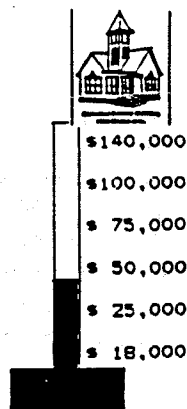

## *In Memoriam* TRIBUTE TO MICKEY



MALCOLM CAMPBELL, June 25, 1920 - June 30, 1994.

Mickey's whole life - his whole heart was spent helping people. He was born in Iowa, but his early years were spent in Lakeside on Palm Row Drive. He worked for the Clarence Foster Dairy in El Monte and also for the Philbrooks. A happy memory was the time he and Leonard camped out on Eagle Peak on the old Marcks place, and they took a ride down the old flume.



He attended the Community Presbyterian Church and established some lasting friendships during the Christian Endeavor years. He graduated from Lakeside Grammar School in 1933. (See the month of September photo in this years calendar.)

The family then moved to San Diego where he enrolled in Wilson Junior High School. It was there he met DOROTHY, fell in love and married in 1938. He dropped out of Hoover High school after the 10th grade to work and help his family financially.

MICKEY and DOROTHY moved to La Mesa about 1954. Raising three sons and one daughter involved both of them in PTA and other youth organizations, especially Scouts. MICKEY received the Scouts highest honor - the Silver Beaver Award for his 27 years of service. He was an Honorary Life Member of PTA; a member of American Legion Post 282 in La Mesa; the Lakeside Historical Society; and moderator of La Mesa Congregational Church.

When the Lakeside Historical Society began the restoration of the Olde Community Church in 1986, MICKEY threw himself wholeheartedly into the project. He could be found at the Church almost every Saturday working with other "crew" members. As if that wasn't enough, he would load up his pick-up, and haul work home to work on during the week. One such project was sanding, repairing, and painting the large folding doors which



divide the rooms. MICKEY was always there to help with special events - setting up - cleaning up - locking up.

The decision of the Lakeside Historical Society to buy the property from the Presbyterian Church had his approval and he has served on the acquisition committee from the beginning. Many of our members have expressed a desire to contribute to the Lakeside Historical Society building fund in his memory. Gifts may also be sent to the La Mesa Congregational Church or Boy Scouts of America.

Besides his wife, DOROTHY, survivors include three sons: KENNETH who recently retired from the Santee Fire Department; MALCOLM of Upland and Stuart of Larned, Kansas; one daughter, BARBARA KOTULA of Fallbrook; three sisters: CATHERINE WOODRUFF; MARY FRANCES OUELETTE and DOROTHY DAMON; eight grandchildren and one great grandchild.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF LAKESIDE VISIT US

On June 28th the Olde Community Church had about 30 young visitors from the Boys & Girls Club of Lakeside. They were given a tour of the building and then a slide show of Lakeside's history. The following day, June 29th, we had 15 younger members of the same club visit and view a slide show.

We are delighted to have these groups visit and show an interest in their hometown. If you visit our store - be sure to see the "Thank you" card on display.

Each year the children of Lakeside's third grades have a unit on Lakeside history. The schools that ask for it - can have the slide show from the Historical Society's collection. It is hoped that many of the children will remember what they saw and pass on the information to their family. Many recount their family histories and are descendants of early Lakeside families. It is gratifying to see the responses of these children and to get the letters from them. These letters are put into the archives so their descendants can read them.



On June 14th I was invited to join a field trip to all the sites the children had seen in the

slide show and our museum. It was an enjoyable day viewing the Castle House, the Klien Ranch and the Cottage (Marcella's house), the Second school and the area where the Cork Elms grew. They saw Cecil's and the site of the Inn before touring the museum.

They saw the Boathouse but had to imagine the racetrack around the lake. They glimpsed the first bakery oven and were reminded of the fire bell on the site of Leo's Pharmacy. Then on to Town Hall, the train depot and Birchard's. Then a tour of the Olde Community Church. They viewed Payton's (Park Market) and the Mortuary (Dr. Carlile is on the site of

Dr. Ireys' home).

They saw the flagpole dedicated to Otto Marcks at the L.M.S., the Riverview High School site. They went on to see the Ferry Ranch, the Lighthouse moved from Ballast Point to Palm Row. Then on to the Thum Ranch now the site of El Capitan High School and the remains of the cactus on the hill.

After a lunch served by the parents in Lindo Lake Park the tour finished with Lakeview's first school and the Windmill House on the Los Cochis Rancho. A whirlwind tour, but the students all promised to take their parents to see it all at a slower pace. They can all be proud to be a Lakesider!

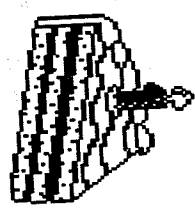
