Randy (Duke) Cunningham, (R- 51st District) supports this Bill. The Duncan Bill advocates giving the deed to the 218 year old Army post to the public corporation with directions to sell the Presidio golf course, Letterman Hospital and other buildings to the highest bidder. Instead of 1,288 acres, the park would consist of 200 acres just along the bay and coast shores. More detailed information is available to the Society.


#### VACATION NEWS

Everyone enjoyed the luncheon platter of a Chicken Casserole and assorted melons. Here are the recipes many asked for -

#### CHICKEN CASSEROLE

1 whole chicken cooked & diced 1-1/2 diced celery

2 tsp. chopped onion 3 cups cooked rice

1/2 cup chopped water chestnuts 1/2 tsp salt

1 10-1/2 oz can Cream of Chicken Soup

1 tablespoon lemon juice 1/4 tsp. pepper

3/4 cup mayonnaise mixed with 1/4 cup water.

Potato chips.

Mix all ingredients. Put in greased casserole dish, top with 1 cup crushed potato chips. Bake at 400 for 15 minutes, or until thoroughly heated.

#### LEMON FLUFF

2 cups flour - 3/4 cup margarine melted - 1/2 cup powdered sugar Mix together and pat lightly in 9 x 13 pan - Bake 20 minutes at 325 While baking - in blender mix well

3 eggs

1/2 cup lemon juice

2 cups sugar

5 tablespoon flour

1 teaspoon each of baking powder & lemon rind

Pour gently over baked crust and bake again 25 minutes at 325.

Remove from oven and sprinkle top with powered sugar.


