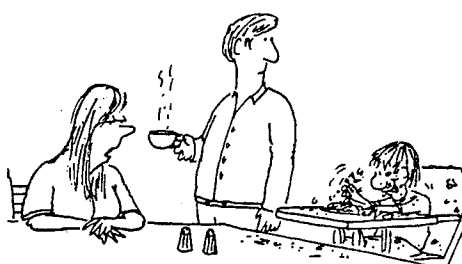

A GOOD REASON TO VOLUNTEER - Slowing down can hasten death. . . People who slow down after retirement may speed up their slide toward the grave, say doctors studying what keeps people healthy and alert into their 70s, 80s and beyond. People may coast into their sixth and seventh decades on the strength of genes, but lifestyle changes usually help carry them even further, doctors say. "Just as you can become a physical couch potato, you can also become a mental couch potato," said Dr. K. Warner Schaie of Pennsylvania State University, one of several researchers who presented their work to the American Association for the Advancement of Science over the weekend. "It's 'use it or lose it'. If you don't engage in intellectual activities you can lose the ability," he said.

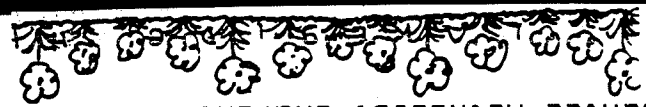

Services were held at Santee United Methodist Church where he and his wife, GERTRUDE, were active members for many years. BILL was born in Centralia, IL, and lived in Lakeside for 36 years He served in the Army as Staff Sergeant in WWII - 18 yrs as a teacher in the Lakeside School District. BILL was a member of Toastmasters International; a life Member of the Lakeside Friends of the Library. He was an instrumental force in reviving the Lakeside Historical Society at a time when it might have dissolved, and he continued working to help make it the successful Society it is today. He was our faithful "store-keeper" each Thursday.

Survivors besides his wife of 54 years include a son, PHILLIP of Atlanta, GA; a daughter, JANET ENGBERG of La Mesa; a sister, MARGARET SEWALL of Lakeside; and 2 grandchildren. Memorial donations may be sent to Lakeside Historical Society or Santee Methodist Church.

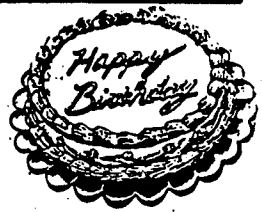

I started a grand tour going back in time and seeing places of history I had always heard and read about.

I telephoned Lakeside from Jerusalem anxiously inquiring about my family in the earthquake area - Charly reported no one was hurt, minimal damage to structures - dishes; TVs; etc; anything that could topple over - DID.

No one was hurt - I could forget about the quake and concentrate on the "overload" of information I was seeing and hearing. Weather, accommodations, food and traveling companion were first class. Returned home with 3 rolls of exposed film, luggage filled with dirty laundry and I was absolutely exhausted!
