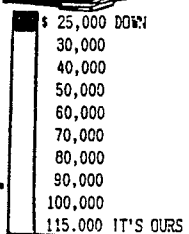

We were split into two groups with docents RUTH SCHULTZ and JOAN STEIBERG. Many had visited the Mission de Alcalá before - but perhaps they heard and saw something new with the aid of a Docent. A visit in the Gift Shop and off to visit the brand new Mission Trails Regional Park Information Center to be guided by Ranger Dione.

It is a high-tech nature center covering eight-square miles including Lake Murray. The parks central location, while distinctly rural in mood, makes it immediately convenient to school and tourist group tours, to hikers and naturalists.

A donation was made to the Mission and \$165.00 for our building fund.

NEWS FOR OUT-OF-TOWN MEMBERS

Los Cochés Road, between Old Highway 80 & Julian Ave., will be getting a long awaited face life come Sep. or Oct. Due to community growth the two-mile construction will transpose the existing 30-35-foot wide road to 64 feet wide and will also include other major changes and improvements. All property owners were compensated long ago for this project with the exception of about five and the Right of Way Dept. is currently in the purchasing process.

Great Western Bank on Winter Gardens Blvd was robbed by a man who acted as if he had a gun and escaped with about \$1,600.

U.S. Navy plans a housing development near State Route 67 & Willow Road causing some riled Lakeside residents. Project critics, including the Lakeside Community Planning Group, the Lakeside Union School District and the Lakeside Fire Protection District contend the proposed construction will devastate the local community. The Navy, however, has the backing of East County Congressman Duncan Hunter, who says the housing is needed.

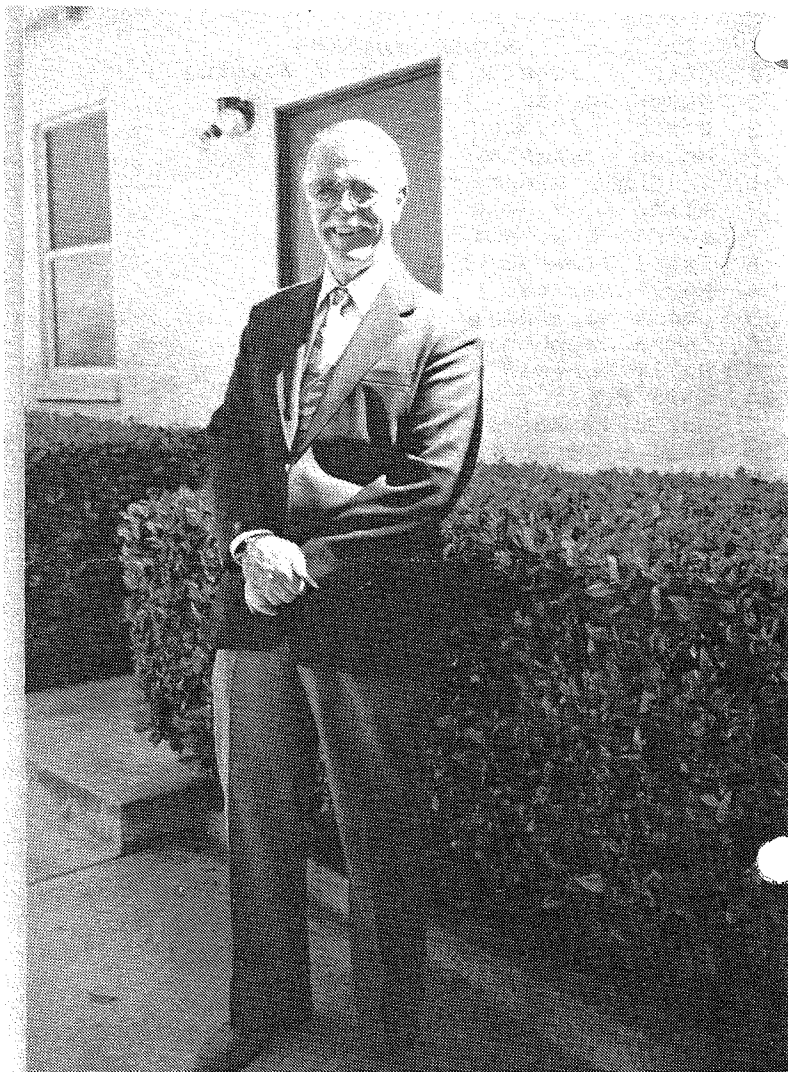

EVOLUTION OF THE LAKESIDE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Without a doubt, Florence Beadle was the inspiration behind the formation of the present society. From 1937, when she finally settled in Lakeside. She became interested in local history. She interviewed old-timers, wrote information on scraps of paper, napkins, anything on hand. She collected photos and newspaper clippings and wrote articles for the local papers.

When her health began to fail, she turned over some priceless old photographs to Gene Claussen, Principal at Lakeview Grammar School. He saw the need to have an organization of interested people to carry on Flossies work. In March, 1972, a meeting was called at Lakeside School and the Lakeside Historical Society was born. Twenty one charter members elected Dr. Sam Sloan as first president. A Position he held for two years. Many dedicated people have contributed to the success of the society and much has been accomplished as we enter our 25th year. Our membership is now 525. Many of whom reside far away from Lakeside, but return in October for the Hometown reunion. I doubt that Gene had an inkling how far his inspiration would go, Much of the success is due to the leadership of the Presidents.

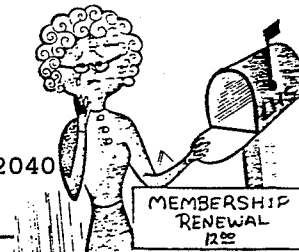

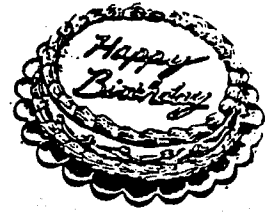
