Some of the duties of the Volunteer Patrol Program (VPP) will be:

- Make vacation home security checks - Visiting the homebound as part of the "You Are Not Alone" program - Enforce handicapped parking regulations - Patrol in vehicles clearly marked as part of the VPP - Assist Crime Prevention with public presentations - Conduct residential and business security surveys - Provide citizen assistance (such as information, directions, etc.) - Assisting with traffic control - Marking abandoned vehicles and other assigned jobs or services as needed.

In Memoriam

GENEVIEVE LAYMAN, 81, died March 13, 1995. She spent 18 years in Lakeside restoring the Castle House where she and her husband, DAVID, resided. GENEVIEVE shared her home with the community by holding Open House many times. GENEVIEVE worked on genealogical research with the Mormon Battalion Historical Organization. She was an honorary Life Member of LHS.

A memorial service was held March 20 at the LDS Chapel in El Cajon where she was a faithful member. Survivors, besides her husband of 50 years, include a son, THOMAS of El Cajon; Daughters, VINNETTE LAYMEN of Lakeside and VICTORIA GILBERT of Santee; 5 grandchildren and twin great-grandchildren.

PROGRESS? One of Lakeside's remaining open spaces has lost out to the symbol of sprawling American suburbia: the shopping center. 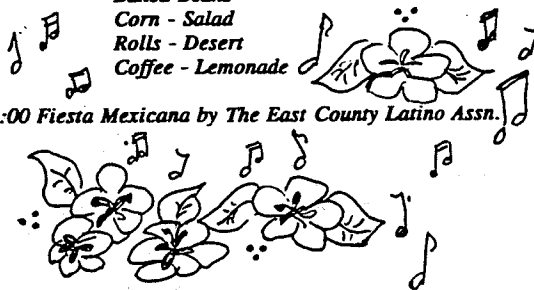
