The old saying is true that no matter where you go, there you are.

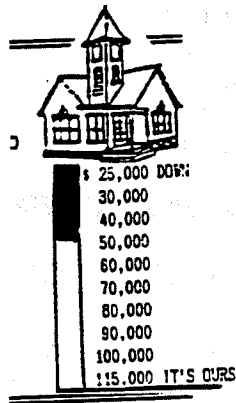
TREASURERS MESSAGE

DRIVE THROUGH HEART SURGERY SUBMITTED BY LEX BOSWELL

On April 4th this year, Balboa Hospital discovered a 95% blockage in the left arterial descending artery of my heart. The Navy considered this life threatening and immediately schedule me for Scripps Clinic for possible corrective surgery. This surprised me somewhat, because I had experienced only slight chest pain and only after vigorous exercise.

After a brief examination the day before, I checked into Scripps the morning of April 7th and by 10 AM was in the operating room for an angioplasty to open the artery. This was followed by the placement of a stent at the affected area. (A stent is a stainless steel wire sleeve that holds the artery open and reduces the chances of blockage again.) This was accomplished in about twenty minutes by going through my right arm rather than my groin which would have required a much

longer recovery time. By 6:30 PM the same day I was released and felt well enough on the way home to visit my son at Kaiser who had back surgery that day. After an excellent night's sleep, I took a 1½ mile walk the next morning but at a slightly slower pace than normal just to be on the cautious side.

In July, I took a follow-up treadmill test and passed with flying colors and, it appears at this point, that I have about a 95% chance of total success. This will be confirmed by my 6 month treadmill test in October.

I write this just to illustrate how heart problems can be fixed sometimes without open heart surgery. I also feel very fortunate to have been diagnosed in time to have been a beneficiary of this procedure.
