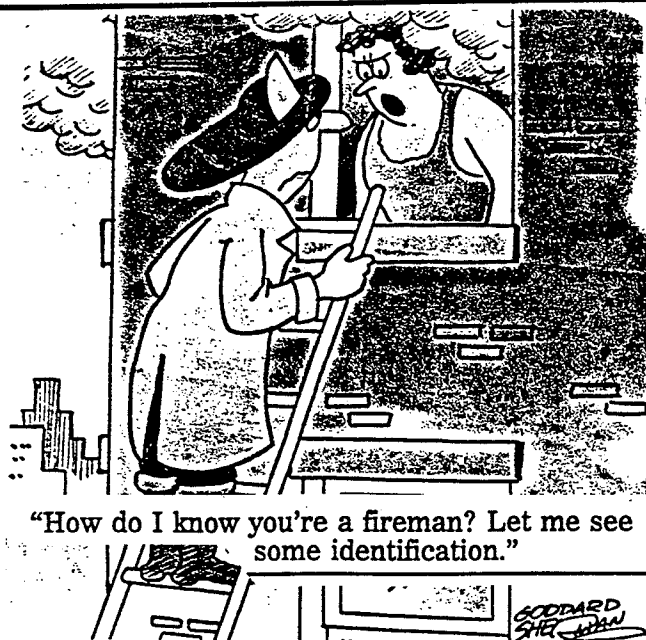

CONVENTION TIME IN SAN DIEGO - - and most appropriate - - **Marcella Williams** found the following recipe of **Elizabeth Dole's**, baked and shared the delicious cookies with us at the **TED ROBERTS MEMORIAL**.

Dole's Pecan Roll Cookies

Makes 3-3/4 dozen -

Prep: 20 minutes.

Bake: at 275 for 45 minutes.

1 cup (2 sticks) margarine, at room temperature

1/4 cup confectioners' sugar, plus additional for coating baked cookies

1 tablespoon cold water

1 teaspoon vanilla

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 cups pecan pieces

1. Heat oven to 275. Grease baking sheet.
2. With mixer on medium speed, beat together margarine and 1/4 cup confectioners' sugar in medium-size bowl until smooth and creamy. Beat in water and vanilla. On low speed, gradually beat in flour. Mix in pecans with a wooden spoon or by hand.
3. With floured hands, roll 2 teaspoons dough for each cookie into datelike shapes. Place on greased baking sheet. Score top of each cookie lengthwise with knife.
4. Bake in 275 oven for 45 minutes. Roll in confectioners' sugar while still warm.

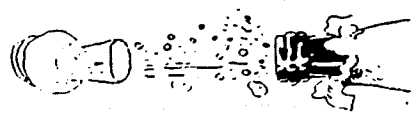
