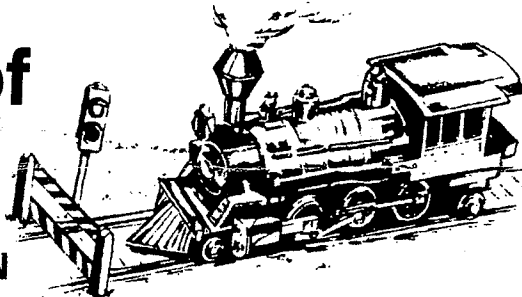

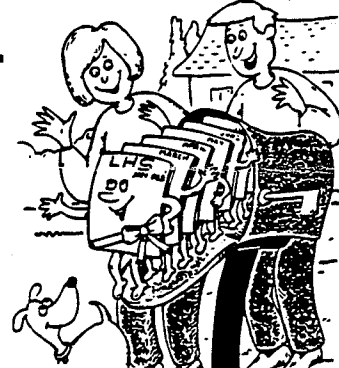

In Memoriam

MARGE WATKINS passed away November 20th. She and her husband, BOB, owned the Bake-Sweet Shop on Maine Street from 1947 to 1962. They recently celebrated their 60th Wedding Anniversary at the Olde Church. Besides her husband survivors include a daughter, BARBARA; two sons, ROBERT, Jr. and CHARLES; several grandchildren and great-grandchildren. GRACE KALSTROM DALTON, 85, passed away recently in Austell, GA. Grace came to Lakeside in 1922 with her parents and 5 brothers. She graduated from Grossmont High School in 1929 and from Mercy College of Nursing, San Diego, in 1933. Grace married LIONEL DALTON and moved to Memphis, TN where she resided for 37 years.

She, as well as other members of the KALSTROM family were very active in the Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church.

Grace was a Life Member of the Lakeside Historical Society, and one of our faithful far-away supporters.

Survivors include a son, JAMES BRADLEY DALTON, GA; three daughters; MARY LOU, TN; KATHY, MN; and BETTY, CO; two brothers, GEORGE and JAMES KALSTROM, both of CA.

ANNIE HANSEN died suddenly at her home in Lakeside December 5. Graveside services were held at Nuevo Memory Gardens, Ramona. She was born in Gadsen, AZ and earned her teaching credential from Arizona State University at Tempe.

ANNIE is survived by her husband, JACK; daughters, PAULA KLEMA and JOHANNA HANSEN WHISMAN; two grandsons, DUSTIN BERG and ELDEN WHISMAN; two sisters, MARY KRISKOVICH and MARGARET POTTORFF; a brother, PETER SEGULJA. She was a Life Member of the Lakeside Historical Society.

BOB ANGUS, 78, died December 1 after a five month battle with leukemia.

His career with The Associated Press in sports journalism began in 1939 and ended with his retirement in 1983. He was a member of the Greater San Diego Sports Association, the Lakeside Historical Society and the Lakeside Presbyterian Church.

Survivors include his wife of 57 years, JEAN CONANT ANGUS; a daughter, KATHY PADDOCK of Bakersfield; two sons, MIKE, of El Cajon, and DAVID, of New York; a sister, VIOLA KEEGAN; and two brothers, MITCH and JOHN all of San Diego; eight grandchildren; three great-grandchildren. 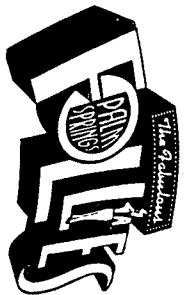
