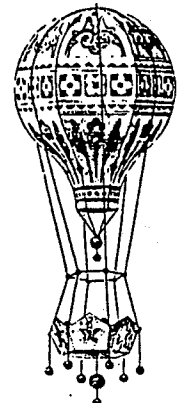

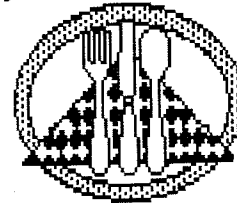

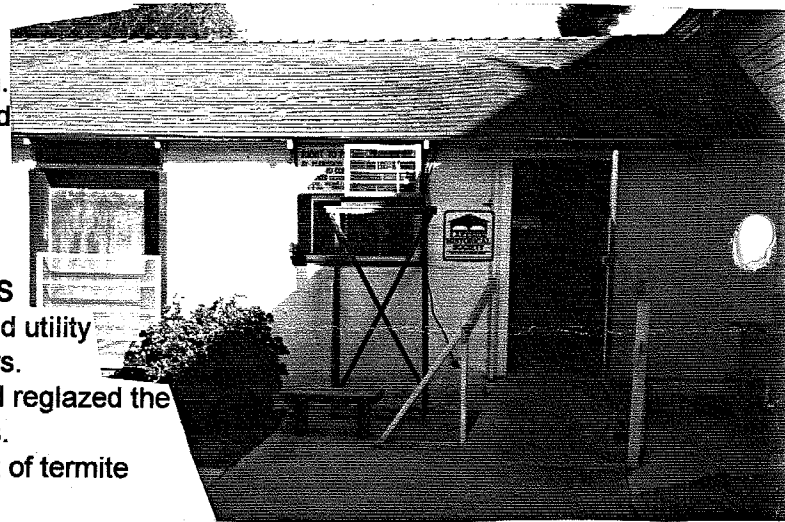

INSIDE: ELAINE BRACK directed the huge project of termite removal and the floor being shored up.

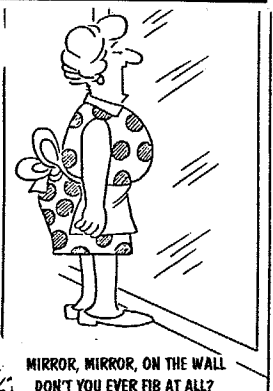
