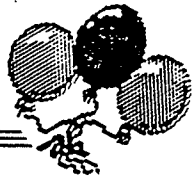

TREASURERS REPORT by ELAINE BRACK

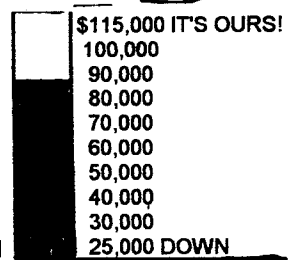
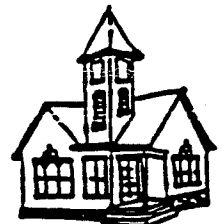

HISTORICAL PROGRAM March 25th meeting by BETTY McMILLEN

Beginning 7pm our guest speaker for the evening will be **DON VAN HOOSER**, who will tell of the formation and history of the San Diego County Sheriff Department.

In 1981, after serving 28 years as a Deputy Sheriff, **MR. VAN HOOSER** and **SHERIFF DUFFY** co-founded the **SHERIFF'S MUSEUM** in Santee. He and his volunteers work to collect memorabilia and preserve the history of law enforcement in San Diego County.

The Lakeside Historical Society and friends are scheduled to have a tour of the museum on **Saturday, March 30 at 11am**. The museum is located at the Santee Sheriff Station, 8811 Cuyamaca. There is no admission charge.

Lakeside Historical Society was honored when three members received special recognition. San Diego and Imperial Counties *Congress of History* presented us a framed certificate of recognition stating:

BARBARA WHITLOCK as Past President and Centennial Chairperson accepted the honor. She has been responsible for the planning, and executing of the many special activities of our six months Centennial Celebration.

RALPH "ANDY" ANDERSON received a *Congress of History Award of Honor* for his contributions to the preservation of San Diego County history as a result of all he has done to restore and preserve the Olde Community Church.

ANDY was instrumental in purchasing, transporting and converting the buildings into our Museum situated in Lindo Park. Since 1986 when LHS first leased the Olde Church for the purpose of restoring it to it's 1886 condition he has strengthened the foundation, painted, plumbed, plastered, replaced and glazed windows, built steps and ramps making them accessible for the handicapped. He did most of the construction of the decorative wall around our Memorial Gardens. **ANDY** has acquired and furnished many much needed materials and he and his truck are always on call for unforeseen emergencies. Since purchasing the property **ANDY** has assisted with all money making activities necessary to meet our monthly mortgage payments.

Lakeside Chamber of Commerce presented **EDNA SWINK KOUNS** with the 1995 *Harry J. Spence Citizen of the Year Award*. Senator **DAVID KELLY** also honored **EDNA** with a Certificate of Recognition.

From 1946 to 1960 **EDNA** worked for the best education possible for all children. Some of her many activities were President of the PTA's of Lakeside Grammer School (only school in Lakeside); El Capitan Council; Grossmont High School and El Capitan High School. **EDNA** also served on the Lakeside School Board. With the formation of LHS, her attention was on the preservation of Lakeside's history and old buildings where most of her efforts was in restoring, purchasing and obtaining Historical Status of the first church of Lakeside.

"We feel the above Honors belong to the entire LHS membership. To accomplish our restoration project and purchase of our Historic Olde Church takes many people working together. We would like to thank each of you for your encouragement, donations of money, materials, labor, and items to sell in our store. At the rate we are going it won't be many years before the mortgage will be paid off and it will be totally ours. Let's keep up the good work."



To the Members of the Board, and all others responsible for my great surprise on Saturday, March 2, 1996, I give my sincere thanks.

I shall treasure this "Award of Honor." My only regret is that all your names could not be on this plaque as well. You have steadfastly, through the years, labored long hours to make our society succeed. We were once a tiny group of dedicated people, but today our membership has grown to 500 + members.

We now have our permanent home at the old Presbyterian Church and again thanks to all of you for those long hours that made our dreams come true. I am proud to be a member of LHS, and knowing that our children and grandchildren's lives will be richer because, through our efforts, we have preserved the history of our community of Lakeside, California.

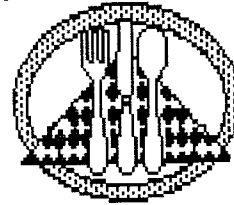

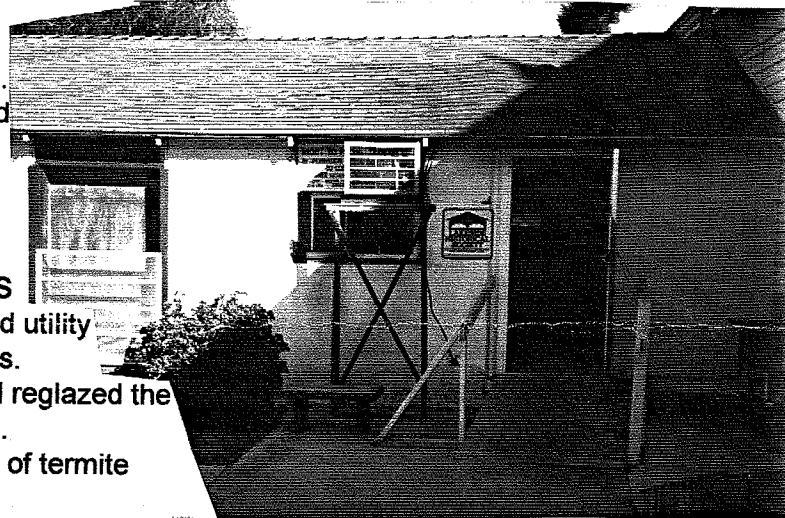

INSIDE: ELAINE BRACK directed the huge project of termite removal and the floor being shored up.

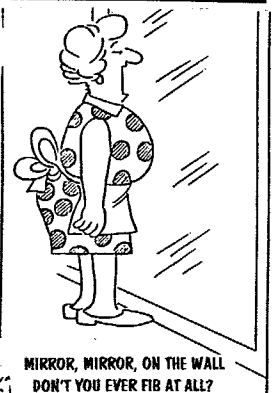

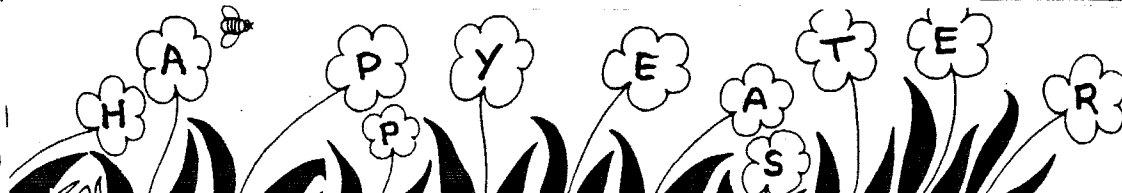


MEMORIALS

In Memoriam



DONALD RICE, 73, of El Cajon, died Tuesday, February 20th. A funeral service was held Wednesday at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery.

DON was born November 2nd, 1922, in San Rafael, CA. He retired from the U.S. Navy and moved to El Cajon where he worked for Nelson-Sloan. He and his wife, **MARCELLA**, were host and hostess at June Lake during the summer months and returned to El Cajon in the winter. He was a member of El Cajon Elks Club and a long time member of Lakeside Historical Society

Besides his wife of 50 years, he is survived by a daughter, **MARTY**; a grandson, **JOSH**, and his sister, **GRACE KNOBLOCK** of Apple Valley.

TED ROBERTS, 81, former pastor of the Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church, died suddenly Monday, February 26th in his home.



MR. ROBERTS was born July 21, 1914 in Chase City, Virginia. He began his career as a teacher at Randolph Macon Military Academy and continued his education at Union Theological Seminary in Virginia, doing graduate work at Princeton Seminary. He served as assistant pastor at the First Presbyterian Church in Texas. In 1943, he was commissioned as a Lt.J.G. in the U.S. Navy and served in the Pacific Fleet during World War II.



He came to Lakeside at the age 35 while recovering from tuberculosis in an interim capacity which grew into 32 years. He built the small Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church into a church which was known in the Presbytery of San Diego as one whose influence reached into all areas of the community, into its religious, social and artistic life. His heart was here and after his retirement in 1981 he chose to remain, tending his fruit trees, creating a welcoming place for his children and their families and his friends, and working still in the community. His last public appearance was on February 11th leading a service to celebrate the 100th year anniversary of the Olde Church.



Services were held at the Lakeside Presbyterian Church Sunday, March 3, 1996. The family asks that in lieu of flowers, contributions be made either to the Lakeside Historical Society or Lakeside Gardens.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, **SYBIL**. Survivors include his wife, **CAROL**; daughters, **BUFFY ROBERTS DAIGNAULT** of LaVerne; **CAROL** and **PATTY ROBERTS** of Colorado; **SHARON CLARK CARPENTER** of Santa Cruz;

sons, **KEN CLARK** of Florida; **DOUG CLARK** of Arcata; **ALEXANDER ROBERTS** of Japan and **DRU CLARK** of San Diego; six granddaughters and three grandsons.

MR. ROBERTS was a member of the Lakeside Kiwanis Club and the Lakeside Historical Society, and was active in preservation efforts for the Olde Church Building on Maine Avenue.

TED ROBERTS' last moments were spent in the home he loved and in the town which he also loved. Its people were his joy (and sometimes his frustration) but he felt himself a part of Lakeside as it grew. He felt it was so appropriate that the building which was once the center of Lakeside's social and religious life would become the focus of the group whose aim was to gather and protect the history of the town.

He enjoyed the closeness of a small town. He enjoyed coming upon friends at the post office and at the gas station and at the Olde Church. His many years in service to the community and his caring involvement in the lives of others were evident in the standing-room crowd at the service to celebrate his life and bid him farewell at the Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church on Sunday the 3rd of March. Many spoke about how he touched their lives and many carried their memories silently in their hearts. All came to honor a man who gave every ounce of his energies and his strengths, his talents and his time in serving those in our community and in the greater church.

His family has deep gratitude to the Lakeside Historical Society for preserving the history of Lakeside so faithfully, and especially for their loving help in the reception following the service on March 3rd. He would have loved it, and in his usual way, would have been the final one out the door, greeting the last one to leave. They also wish to thank all of the many people who have shown their love of **TED** both in deed and in spirit.

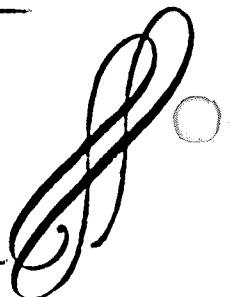
