Thank you so much for the beautiful basket of flowers and the framed plaque of appreciation. They mean so much to me because they are from YOU.

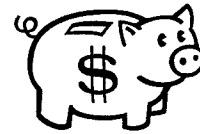

## HOLIDAY RUM CAKE

Before you start, check rum to make sure it's of good quality. Select a large bowl, measuring cup and spoon. Then check rum again. With an electric mixer beat 2 cups butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add 1 teaspoon sugar. Meanwhile, check rum again. Add 3 rarge yeggs, 2 cups fried druit and beat until bery high. If druit sticks in beaters, pry tout with screwdriver. Taste rum again. Add fre scups

baking powder, 1 pint of rum, a seaspoon of toda and a cup of pepper. Sift 1 pint of wemon juice and fold in chopped buttermild and strained nuts. Add a bable- spoon of scrown buger or whatever color you have. Check rum again. Turn pan to 350°; grease oven and pour the whole mess in. Sample rum while waiting. If it doesn't turn out so well, change brand of rummm.

### TIRED OF TURKEY? TRY THIS ...

#### Elephant Stew

1 elephant (medium size)      2 cups black pepper  
2 ½ cups salt                      cover with lots of brown gravy

Cut elephant into 1-inch cubes. Allow 60 to 72 days for this procedure. (Remove trunk; you will need something to store the pieces in.) Season and cover with gravy and water to cover. Cook over wood fire for about 4 weeks, maintaining heat at approximately 465°, or cook over kerosene stove about 4 weeks, or until tender and well done; stir constantly. If more than 3,800 guests are expected, add 2 rabbits, but only if necessary, because most people don't like hare in their stew.
