# MORTGAGE-BURNING PARTY

The Lakeside Historical Society is finally seeing their dream come true now that they have paid off the mortgage on the 102 year old church building located on Maine Avenue.

On June 24th, 1986 the Lakeside Historical Society asked to lease the old church built in 1896 which had been neglected and was in total disrepair. We agreed to restore, repair and beautify it as closely as possible to the beautiful and much used church so many of our members remembered and loved. We wanted to save and share it with the community and also improve the looks of our town.

This church is the second oldest building remaining in the original Lakeside Townsite. We wanted to make it again available for small weddings, memorial services, anniversaries and meeting place for

local organizations and groups as it was in it's earlier years.

Members, friends and several businesses of Lakeside went to work. They plastered walls, shored up the bell tower, jacked up sagging floors, reroofed, rewired, plumbed, poured cement, got rid of termites, repaired 100+ year old reed organ and a square grand piano built in 1865 that had been used in the ball room of the Lakeside Inn, replaced stained glass windows, painted inside and out, refinished pews and beautified the yard.

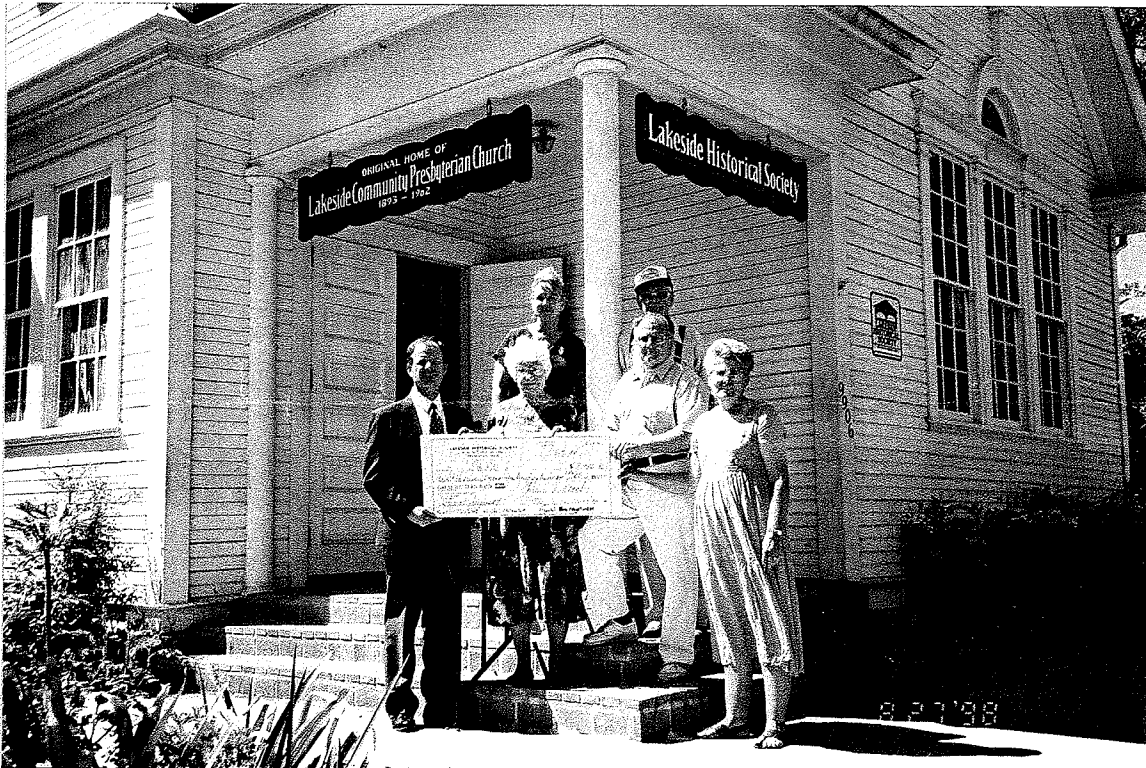
In December of 1994 we were given the opportunity to purchase the property from our Landlord--Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church.

We were given ten years to pay off the mortgage but because of the wonderful support and

response of our members, friends and businesses we made our last payment in August 1998. We can't thank all of you enough who have generously donated labor, material, money and helped with the many fund raisers.

We - - all of us - - have an investment of three quarters of a million dollars. The only outside money were three grants (\$35,000) used in restoration thanks to our Supervisor Dianne Jacob.

A mortgage-burning ceremony is being planned for the 21st Annual Home Town Reunion which will be held October 25th at the Olde Community Church, 9906 Maine Avenue. A catered lunch will be served at 12:30. All are invited to join the celebration and fun. For information and reservations call 443-5512 or 561-1886.

"DID YOU KNOW" by CHRIS HERZOG

... San Diego County is California's oldest county (1850) and offers the casual observer a treasury of significant historical sites to explore.

Amidst the nearly 4,300 square miles there are nearly 800 landmarks of historic importance and several hundred additional potential sites waiting for designation.

The marking of historical landmarks has involved the volunteer efforts of many historical societies, and committees. Among the San Diego County groups which have helped authenticate and finance plaques has been the Squibob Chapter of E Clampus Vitus, a fraternal organization. During the past 35 years, the organization has participated in research and placed markers at its own expense at 22 sites in San Diego County - - those rock monument formations with the brass plaques that we all have seen in our travels.

The California Register of Historical Resources program is the state's newest registration program intended to be used by state and local agencies, private organizations, and citizens to identify, register, evaluate, and protect our state's significant historical and archeological resources.

It is anticipated that the resurrection of the Historic Site board by the local board of Supervisors will give us back the momentum in which several hundred more sites of historic importance in the unincorporated areas can be named as community landmarks, or at least save some of our buildings.

The Edgemoor Farm barn in Santee with its impressive Dutch gambrel roof, is the last remaining example of its type and period known to survive in San Diego County. Survive is the key word.

What is the fate of this establishment today, and other buildings in our communities that we enjoy living with and take for granted. The barn, built in 1913, was part of a ranch and farm that was a **national** leader in scientific dairy stock-breeding and in the breeding of polo ponies.

After much governmental labor, the History Center or the Olde Community Church in Lakeside is in the process of becoming an historic site. It is important to keep these sites, we have lost so much - - just think what the presence of the old Lakeside Inn in the park could do for Lakeside today.

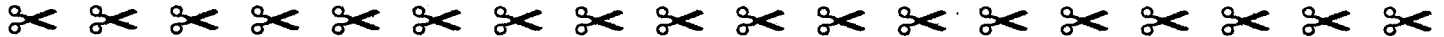

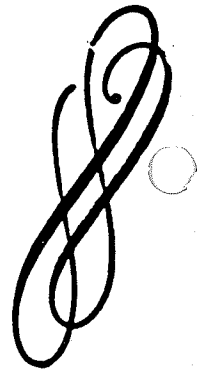
THE TATE FAMILY
