HISTORIC CHIMNEYS REPAIRED

The old chimney atop the Olde Community Church has a new look. Next time you're by LHS, take a look at our two chimneys: on the Church and on the Museum (manse). Both brick structures were looking worse for wear, with crumbling and missing bricks evident. Thanks to the Chimney Sweeps, a local business on Maine Avenue, both chimneys were repaired in a style consistent with their original designs. The project was financed by a generous family grant.

Neither chimney is now in use, but it was important to maintain the historic aesthetic. In the past, the church chimney vented wood-burning stoves heating the chapel. The manse stack vented the kitchen stove and other heaters.
