
the museum and gift shop. There were a few old Model T's that went down Maine Avenue in our town.

LAKESIDE WATER DISTRICT CELEBRATES 100 YEARS OF SERVICE 1924-2024

From PIPELINE June 2024, a community newsletter published by the Lakeside Water District

After a community vote of 53 to 3 in favor of a new irrigation district and by order of the Board of Supervisors of San Diego County, the Lakeside Water District was officially recognized on August 11, 1924. The community leaders of the newly formed district were able to serve the area's homes, businesses, and farms, supplying water from groundwater and a connection to the Cuyamaca Flume in the eastern part of the district.


The first major challenge that the district faced was the need to raise \$35,000 for the construction of the Castle Court Reservoir and downtown pipelines, some of which remain in service today. The second challenge was the Great **Depression**, which tested the community's resolve to keep the young water district.

Other significant events:

- In 1944, Lakeside Water District was one of the nine original members of the San Diego County Water Authority.
- In August 1950, the district supported the Eucalyptus Hills Annexation and the significant infrastructure installation it required, as well as the San Diego County Water Authority connection.
- In November 1955, by giving up its seat on the Water Authority board to the Rio San Diego water agency, Lakeside led in the formation of the Rio San Diego Municipal Water District which made it the lead wholesale water agency of the Lakeside, Santee, and Alpine areas. Rio San Diego was renamed Padre Dam Municipal Water District in December 1976.
- The district's infrastructure quadrupled during the building boom of the 1960s, with more reservoirs, pipelines, and pump stations.
- June 1973 saw Lakeside Water District consolidate with Lakeside Farms Mutual Water District.
- In November 2006, important changes were implemented. Lakeside detached from the Padre Dam Municipal Water District and combined with the Riverview Water District.



In 1885, the sole source of water in the area was from wells with windmills. By 1886, the Cuyamaca earthen dam was built and construction of the flume began. This monumental endeavor used nearly nine million board feet of redwood lumber, which required 100 wagons, pulled by 800 mules and horses, for its transportation from San Diego harbor inland.

More flume photos from the LHS Archives: Continuing with the theme of the Lakeside Water District's Diamond Anniversary (on page 2), we offer a couple more photographs of the flume under construction in the El Monte Valley. The flume was a phenomenal engineering and construction marvel for its time. Completed in 1889, its nine million board feet of redwood lumber used 315 trestles and five tunnels to travel from the diverting dam on Boulder Creek (east side of El Capitan Reservoir), through 33 miles of mountains, valleys, and other rugged terrain, to the Grossmont area. Hundreds of men worked on it, including Chinese and Native laborers. A consistent downward grade of three feet for every mile (from east to west) was necessary for gravity to keep the water moving. The project was finally completed after two years and over \$1 million. Today, six miles of the historic path in El Monte Valley are open to hikers, bikers, and horseback riders. It is a trail not to be missed, with wonderful history and stunning views.
