

FROM THE ARCHIVES: THEN & NOW



The Ross House in 1909 *(above)*. It was built in 1904 by C.W. Ross, who managed the original Lakeside Store formerly located at Maine Avenue and Lakeshore Drive (now the parking lot for Lakeside Liquor). It remained a residence for nearly 90 years until, in 1992, Dr. Jeff Robbins had the interior remodeled as a veterinary office. The site has been used for animal care since then.

Today, the old Ross House is the home of the Lakeside Veterinary Hospital (below). The exterior of the structure looks much the same as it did 120 years ago, except the chimneys are gone (as are the windmills in the yard).



THEFT - BE ON THE LOOKOUT

On November 13, 2024, between 1am and 2am, the antique anvil that had been displayed in front of the museum for many years was stolen. The suspect(s) entered through the front gate and appear to have used a four-wheeled wagon of sorts (we have impression marks on the soil, plus a footprint). The chain securing the anvil was snipped neatly with bolt cutters. The suspect(s) most likely fled west on Parkside Avenue. Our security cameras were able to pinpoint the time and the fact that no car was parked nearby at the time of the crime. The value of the anvil makes this a felony crime. We have filed a **report with the San Diego Sheriff's Office and a detective has been assigned. We hope this information might lead to pos**-sible witnesses or other information to help solve this crime. You can call us at (619) 561-1886 and leave a message.

Lisa Denise Golding Davis

October 7, 1954 - September 25, 1978

Lisa was aboard PSA Flight #182 when the airliner went down in North Park, killing 144 people. She is included on the newly installed site memorial, listed as being from Lakeside. However, we had no information on her at LHS. Our friends at the Grossmont High School Museum, Connie and Lynn Baer, filled us in on this tragedy: "We saw your request for information about Lisa. Sadly, she and another (Grossmont High School) alumnus were on the PSA flight #182. Such a tragedy! We are so happy they have a monument now."

Lisa was born in Norfolk, Virginia. By 1969, she was living in El Cajon. She graduated from Grossmont High School in 1972. She married in February 1978 and was living on Winter Green Drive in

Lakeside at the time of her death. Lisa had been a PSA flight attendant for $3\frac{1}{2}$ years. She was only 23 years of age.
