LAKESIDE HISTORY: THE HOTEL ROW?

An obscure entry has been found in both the 1915 and 1916 San Diego City and County directories:

Hotel Row, Lakeside.

This is only listed under "Hotels" in the "Classified Business Directory," and not in the Lakeside section or in "Furnished Rooms." The 1915 directory carries another interesting find in the Lakeside section, though: "Row Effie E, hotel." There are two more "Row" listings there: Georgia B. Row and Roy Row, carried as a "laborer."

This begs the question: where was it located? How large might it have been? Could it have been a simple boarding house? Unfortunately, we have no other information on this little known Lakeside hotel. We do, however, have information on the Row family.

Effie May Hutchinson was born in Kansas in 1870, the second youngest of 14 children (seven boys and seven girls). She also had seven older half siblings. Effie was 19 years old when she married her husband, James Willard Row. The couple had seven children themselves—six sons and one daughter. By 1893, the family was living in Ramona, where their third child was born. Three more children followed there.

Husband James died in March 1915, the year the Hotel Row first appeared in the local directory. In November 1915, daughter Georgia Row (1891-1924) married Drew Dye, from a historic Ramona family. The official announcement stated both mothers-in-law were living in Lakeside at the time. Sons Roy Row (1889-1950) and Frank Row (1895-1984) played baseball for the Lakeside team of the Valley Association in the mid-1910s. Son James E. Row (1899-1983) attended and graduated from Lakeside Grammar School. Effie may have remarried, but was a widow at the time of her death in 1947, at age 77.

Currently, that is all we know of Lakeside's mysterious Hotel Row. If you know more, please share with us!
