FROM THE ARCHIVES

ROCK ON

From the Archives heads out to Lakeside today for this wonderful shot of three men in a quarry in 1937. Granite from the quarry was used by artist Donal Hord to create the Guardian of the Water sculpture that stands at the County Administration Building. That artwork was dedicated June 10, 1939.

August 9, 2025 - A little bit of Lakeside history was shared across the county in a recent photo feature in the San Diego Union-Tribune (above). To add to the story, this was the Lakeside Silver Grey Granite Company, located in Slaughterhouse Canyon off of State Highway 67. Started in 1936, the company was composed of Pete Matson, Cecil Deering, Erman Kouns, Duncan MacDonald, and William Cameron (of Santee). The granite here was of a very fine texture, quite rare, and considered one of the finest granites in the United States. Both of our historic Lakeside rock houses—the old Kouns home on Winter Gardens Blvd. and the Kanady home (now Lionel's Legacy) on Woodside Avenue—were built with this same stone. Arguably the most famous of the Silver Grey granites stands in front of the County Administration Building on Pacific Highway in Downtown San Diego (as mentioned in the photo story above). One of the men in this photo must be Erman Kouns! (Source: "Legends of Lakeside")



A few years back (2021), VP Rob Harding spotted something out of the corner of his eye near the "new" Presbyterian Church on Channel Road: a depression era fire plug (an equivalent of our fire hydrants today). The LHS Board decided we had to have it, and so wrote a nice letter asking the status of the plug and if we could ever retrieve it in the future. The letter worked and Quinn Johnze of the Lakeside Water District contacted Rob. Turns out it was still live and holding water! LWD had a maintenance plan for it, but made the wonderful decision to extract it for us. Rob met Quinn in the spring of 2023 and loaded it up for LHS. Fast forward to April 2025, when Dorie McMillen Mudd and her hubby Chris installed the historic plug on our property to reflect local fire protection and the fledgling new LWD department of the 1920s and 30s. You can see it now, between our Lakeside

fire alarm ring and the Cedar Fire Memorial. This plug could be 90 years old — and now we won't forget how we protected our town from fire back in the day. (*Photo above*) LWD Operations Superintendent Quinn Johnze, who made this possible for us, poses with our newest artifact from Lakeside's past. Thank you Quinn for working with us!




