

## RAISING TURKEYS WAS SERIOUS BUSINESS IN LAKESIDE

The poultry business was a common one in Lakeside back in the day. Longtime residents can recall numerous chicken ranches here and there, all over town. Turkey ranches were less common, but we had our fair share. The Hamlet Turkey Ranch up on Wildcat Canyon Road raised and sold the big birds for 20 years. I.J. Boyett had a Turkey Ranch and Hatchery in the area of Maplevue and Pine Street. And there was the Parfet Turkey Ranch in Lakeview.

Milton Parfet came to San Diego with his family in an old Willys-Overland when he was 16 years old. Born on a cattle ranch in Golden, Colorado, Milton graduated from Sweetwater High School after the family landed in Chula Vista. He attended UCLA, married Dorothy Hamilton, and lived in San Francisco before returning to San Diego County in 1935. That's when he entered the turkey business at "Cuyamaca Lake." In 1941, Milton bought the 30-acre Grandy Ranch in the Lakeview community of Lakeside, where by 1947 the ranch averaged about 6,000 turkeys and 7,000 chickens annually.

In 1940, Milton began noticing some of his turkeys missing from his Cuyamaca ranch and suspected an employee, one Elmer Winifred Thatcher. Milton enlisted his mother-in-law and sister to try and buy some birds from Mr. Thatcher, who was living in Pacific Beach. The ladies were successful and, after inspecting the poultry, Milton located the Parfet ranch brand on the wings of the hens. Thatcher was arrested by Sheriff's deputies and charged with the theft of nearly 800 turkeys! He pleaded guilty to six counts of grand theft and was sentenced to San Quentin state prison!!

When Thatcher told the judge that he was owed money from the Parfet ranch, the judge retorted, "You claim they owe you wages for stealing their turkeys?"


